DENNIS HAUGER ON POLE IN OK AT LE MANS ON CRG-PARILLA

Dennis Hauger secured a stunning pole position in OK at the European Championship in Le Mans. Changing weather conditions hampered qualifying on Friday, especially OK-Junior's. Overall good results for CRG drivers.



Weather conditions did not help the start of the fourth round of the CIK-FIA European Championship in Le Mans, race that is valid as third act of the OK and OK-Junior campaign and second of KZ2.

After free practice held on Thursday on (very few) sun spells and (several) rain falls, Friday has been devoted to qualifying and it has been characterized by a light rain that stopped only in the evening allowing KZ and OK drivers partaking in the final sessions of the day to put slick tyres on, while their fellow OK-Junior drivers had to use rain tyres in mixed conditions which has been quite tricky.

DENNIS HAUGER GREAT IN OK

CRG colors recorded the excellent, mega pole position taken in OK by Dennis Hauger on CRG-Parilla. He was not only the quickest of his heat, but also posted the absolute best time in 53.155s!

In the third session, Flavio Camponeschi secured a good seventh time in 53.664s, as Kilian Meyer was eleventh in 53.829s. In the first session Michael Rosina posted a great fifth time in 53.786s,

while CRG Holland's Alfred Nilsson was seventh in 53.811s. Callum Bradshaw put in a good performance in the second session posting the fourth quickest time in 53.495s, while Hannes Janker was tenth in 53.687s.

Enrico Prosperi has been shining in KZ2 on CRG-Tm, and he claimed the fifth quickest time in Series-1 completing his best loop in 1:01.802s and Alexander Schmitz of CRG Holland was eighth in 1:02.034s. CRG Holland's Max Tubben run a solid third Series posting the second quickest time in 54.337s, while Alessandro Giardelli was 15th in 55.342s.

In OK-Junior, Pietro Delli Guanti of CRG Keijzer Racing was ninth in Series-1 with a quickest time of 1:06.501s and Donar Munding was 12th in 1:06.780s. The Dutch driver of CRG Keijzer Racing Kas Haverkort put in a great performance in Series-2, posting the second quickest time in 1:04.323s, Francisci Sagrera was 12th in 1:05.325s, and Luca Giardelli also put in a bold performance in Series-3, closing his effort in eighth in 1:08.023s. Gabriel Bortoleto could not find the right lap instead and was 14th in 1:08.580s.

Qualifying heats will take place on Saturday July 1st, while Finals will follow on Sunday July 2nd.
